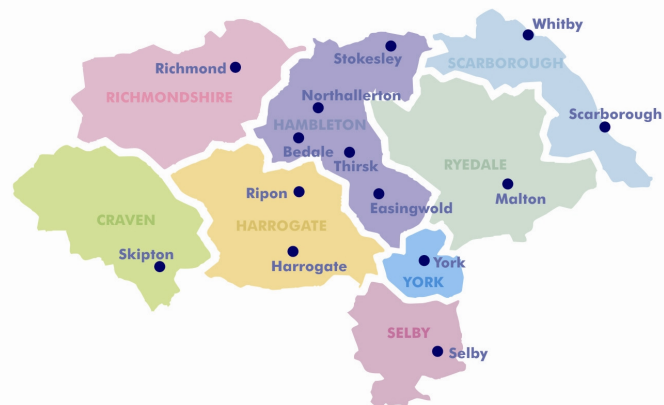

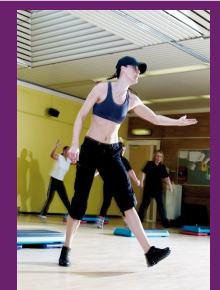

Make good volunteer practice part of your game plan!

Volunteer Centres are local organisations providing support and expertise on all aspects of volunteering. This service is available to organisations that involve volunteers including sports clubs and to potential volunteers in order that they find a suitable volunteer role.

Volunteer Centre services are free and non-obligatory.

Volunteer Centres can provide you with volunteers interested in sport, training in managing volunteers and can also signpost you to further services such as funding opportunities, accounting services and network events.



VOLUNTEERING STATS

The sporting sector makes the single biggest contribution to total volunteering in England – with 26% of volunteers stating sport as their main area of interest.

5,821,400 volunteers contribute to sport (14% of the adult population).

1,209,566,500 hours of sporting volunteering in the year, equating to 720,000 additional paid full time workers.

Volunteers support 106,400 affiliated clubs in England serving over 8 million members.

Volunteer Centres provide support at a local level for individual volunteers and volunteer-involving organisations. They have six core functions to:

Match both groups and individuals interested in volunteering with appropriate opportunities in the local community.

Stimulate and encourage local interest in volunteering and community activity.

Offer advice, promote good practice and offer training in working with volunteers.

Develop local volunteering opportunities.

Campaign to ensure volunteering remains high on government and local agendas.

Influence strategic thinking and planning at regional and national level.
